## Food For All Highlights



Food For All DC (FFA) had another impactful year in 2023. We grew as a useful resource for the D.C. government, private agencies, and health care providers, with 147 new case managers making referrals. We've become an important part of a referral network that supports food-insecure D.C. residents. This year, FFA welcomed two more community partners: Far Southeast Family Strengthening Collaborative

(FSFSC) and MBI Health Services. This strengthens a web of like-minded organizations and expands our reach into less-resourced Wards 7 and 8. Finally, with technical support from Capital Area Food Bank, FFA inaugurated a garden program that will serve as an educational hub for our clients, teaching them how to grow herbs in their own homes.



## OUR RECIPIENTS

Nineteen percent of FFA's clients have a disability and almost half are affected by poor mental or physical health. This means we're an important participant in the lives of those who cannot fully care for themselves. In 2023, we provided food for 764 children, helping nourish their young bodies and brains for a more wholesome childhood.

## OUR VOLUNTEERS

FFA's 45 core volunteers do intake, deliver food, drive trucks, pack bags, and raise funds. They're the backbone of our operation, showing up every week with the spirit of service. Our corporate volunteer program continues to provide meaningful social engagement for local companies.

## OUR SERVICES

We strive to meet clients' personal food choices, accommodating diets based on culture, religion, or health and lifestyle. A typical 30-pound delivery includes the major food groups for a balanced diet. In 2023, we offered birthday treats to celebrate special days with our clients.



**For every \$1 donated, FFA delivers \$7 of services.**

This added value is possible with 503,000 pounds of donated food (valued at \$855,100) and 15,000 volunteer hours (valued at \$375,000) provided in 2023.
