



## HIGHLIGHTS FROM THIS PAST YEAR



### CARE THAT ADAPTS

In 2025, Food For All strengthened its commitment to reaching the most vulnerable residents through home delivery and lunches for people experiencing homelessness. As part of a strong citywide referral network, FFA welcomed 257 new clients referred by 96 local agencies, many living with chronic illness, disability, advanced age, or serious health conditions that make accessing food difficult. Through a personalized approach, FFA responds

with flexibility to each client's unique circumstances, ensuring support is both practical and dignified.

In response to the growing number of clients managing lifestyle-related health conditions, FFA launched a pilot Food as Medicine (FAM) Wellness Circle. An initial cohort of 12 clients receive groceries tailored for conditions such as diabetes, hypertension, and kidney disease, alongside meditation for mental wellbeing and opportunities for social engagement through volunteering. Early outcomes have been encouraging, with reports of improved sleep, stable blood pressure, and positive trends in A1C levels. FAM participants also benefited from a harvest of kale, collard greens, and lettuce from FFA's garden.

Throughout the year, FFA continued providing 55 packed lunches for the unhoused every Friday. Beyond nourishment, these gatherings created space for connection, shared resources, and a renewed sense of camaraderie among participants.

**For every \$1 donated, FFA delivers \$4 of services.**

This added value is possible with 355,000 pounds of donated food (valued at \$603,000) and 15,000 volunteer hours (valued at \$375,000) provided in 2025.

## OUR VOLUNTEERS

FFA's 45 core volunteers do intake, deliver food, drive trucks, pack bags, and raise funds. They're the backbone of our operation, showing up every week with the spirit of service. Our corporate volunteer program continues to provide meaningful social engagement for local companies.



## OUR SERVICES

**Food Distribution:** FFA's signature program delivers groceries to homebound clients across D.C. In 2025, we completed over 10,800 home deliveries, providing a vital service through personalized food support for people with limited income, mobility, or social support.

**Food as Medicine:** In 2025, FFA launched a pilot program to support clients' all-round health. Participants received medically tailored groceries and wellness activities to improve physical, mental, and social wellbeing.

**Lunches for the Unhoused:** FFA remained a dependable source of meals for people experiencing homelessness, providing 2,750 packed lunches throughout the year.

## OUR PARTNERS

FFA's work depends on strong collaboration. The Capital Area Food Bank serves as our primary food partner, complemented by food donations from Amazon Fresh, Safeway and Food Rescue DC. DoorDash supports home deliveries, with over 4,000 subsidized deliveries in 2025, while over 90 referral agencies connect us with residents in need. Together, these partnerships allow us to respond effectively, ensuring support reaches those who need it most.
